Deadlines to submit your application for undergraduate admission and scholarship consideration:

► **Fall-entering students:** Feb. 1 for priority scholarship consideration; the Friday before classes begin is final scholarship deadline.

► **Spring-entering students:** Oct. 15 for priority scholarship consideration; the Friday before classes begin is the final scholarship deadline.

REGENTS DISTINGUISHED TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP (OKLAHOMA RESIDENTS ONLY)	Renewable for up to three years with a 2.0 overall GPA. Eligible students must have 7-23 transferable credit hours AND a 3.25 college GPA.	\$2,500 per year (\$7,500 three-year total)
REGENTS DISTINGUISHED TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP (OKLAHOMA RESIDENTS ONLY)	Renewable for up to two years with a 2.0 overall GPA. Eligible students must have 24+ transferable credit hours AND a 3.25 college GPA.	\$2,500 per year (\$5,000 two-year total)
TRANSFER OUT-OF-STATE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP* (OUT-OF-STATE ONLY)	Renewable for up to three years with a 2.0 overall GPA. Eligible students must have 7-23 transferable credit hours AND a 3.25 college GPA.	\$7,000 per year (\$21,000 three-year total)
TRANSFER OUT-OF-STATE ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP* (OUT-OF-STATE ONLY)	Renewable for up to two years with a 2.0 overall GPA. Eligible students must have 24+ transferable credit hours AND a 3.25 college GPA.	\$7,000 per year (\$14,000 two-year total)
TRANSFER OUT-OF-STATE LEGACY SCHOLARSHIP* (OUT-OF-STATE ONLY)	Renewable for up to three years with a 2.0 overall GPA. Students whose parents or grandparents graduated from OSU are eligible.	\$5,000 per year (\$15,000 three-year total)
TRANSFER OUT-OF-STATE LEGACY ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP* (OUT-OF-STATE ONLY)	Out-of-state students whose parents or grandparents graduated from OSU are eligible. Must have 24+ transferable credit hours AND a 3.25 college GPA.	\$7,000 each of the first two years and \$5,000 if year three is necessary (\$19,000 three-year total)

Students must maintain a minimum GPA and number of credit hours per semester to renew scholarship opportunities each year. Renewable scholarship qualifications may vary. No academic area of emphasis required. Deadlines, figures and admission requirements are subject to change. TRANSFER CHECKLIST

Required for admission

- ☐ **APPLY ONLINE**
Apply at admissions.okstate.edu/apply.
- ☐ **APPLICATION FEE**
Pay the \$40 application fee online, or by check, cash or money order, or apply for an application fee waiver.
- ☐ **SUBMIT TRANSCRIPTS**
Submit official transcripts (print date must be less than three months old) from each institution you've attended. If you have less than 24 credit hours, you must submit your high school transcript and ACT*/SAT scores unless you are applying test optional.

Recommended

- ☐ **SUBMIT YOUR FAFSA**
Using OSU school code 003170, submit your FAFSA at fafsa.gov beginning Oct. 1 in the calendar year prior to the year you plan to attend OSU.
- ☐ **TOUR CAMPUS**
Touring is the best way to get to know campus. You may also meet with a representative for your academic college of choice. Special transfer tour dates are available, but all transfer students are welcome on any day a tour is held. Schedule a virtual experience or in-person visit at admissions.okstate.edu/visit.

- ☐ **REGISTER FOR TRANSFER ORIENTATION & ENROLLMENT**

- ☐ **SIGN UP FOR HOUSING**
Transfer students with less than 30 credit hours earned must live on campus. Some exceptions apply. Sign up for housing and get more information at reslife.okstate.edu.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

7-23 CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED**

► 2.25 Overall College GPA **AND** meet one of the following Freshman Admission Requirements:

- 3.0 unweighted cumulative GPA or higher **AND** top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, **OR**
- 3.0 GPA or higher in 15-unit core **AND** 21 ACT*/1060 SAT or higher, **OR**
- 24 ACT*/1160 SAT or higher.

► Students in this category have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score (test optional).

OR

24-59 CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED**

► 2.25 overall college GPA

OR

60+ CREDIT HOURS ATTEMPTED OR ASSOCIATE DEGREE**

► 2.0 overall college GPA

*OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration.

**Excluding incomplete, in-progress, GPA neutral passing grades (ex: "P" or "S"), remedial/developmental, repeated/forgiven credit and activity courses.
