COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL **STUDENTS** are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, responses to application essays, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

*OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration.

TEST OPTIONAL

Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score. Students may indicate on their application for admission that they would like to be considered as test optional and submit their high school transcript for review. This also applies to home school, private, parochial or other non-public high schools that are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

Currently, consideration for most university scholarships requires an official test score from ACT or SAT, and we encourage students to provide us their test scores as soon as they are available for complete scholarship consideration.
