

Admissions documents required:

- 1. Completed admission application, which also serves as the scholarship application
- 2. \$50 nonrefundable application fee or fee waiver
- 3. Official high school transcript reflecting GPA and class rank

The first step is applying for admission. At Oklahoma State, we're committed to helping qualified students get admitted to OSU to earn their college degrees.

Maximize your scholarship opportunities

Your application for admission is also your application for scholarships, but you could qualify for additional scholarships with these items:

- Official ACT or SAT test score(s)
- Completed essay response
- Leadership and involvement resume (honors, employment, activities, etc.)

The Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline is Nov. 1, while all scholarship materials must be submitted by Feb. 1 to ensure scholarship consideration for most awards for fall-entering students. For more information on how to complete your file, visit admissions.okstate.edu/scholarship-file.

COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW

At Oklahoma State University, ALL **STUDENTS** are encouraged to apply because we individually review each application for our holistic and alternative admission programs. We consider many factors, including high school GPA, ACT or SAT scores, application essay response, academic letters of recommendation, leadership experience, community involvement and accomplishments.

OSU uses the highest cumulative GPA (weighted or unweighted based on a 4.0 scale) indicated on a student's official high school transcript for admission and scholarship purposes. GPAs not using a

ASSURED ADMISSION

Students qualify for assured admission if they meet **ONE** of the following criteria:

- 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher AND top 33.3% rank in high school graduating class, OR
- 3.0 GPA or better in 15-unit core

OSU will accept the official superscore provided by ACT for both admission and scholarship consideration. Some majors may have additional requirements, visit **okla.st/program-admission** for more information.

TEST OPTIONAL

Students have the option to apply to OSU without consideration of a test score. Students who select this option on the application will be considered for admission based on a full review of their high school transcript. Class rank is not required for test optional admission. This also applies to

home school, private, parochial or other non-AND 21 ACT/1060 SAT or higher, OR public high schools that are not accredited by a recognized accrediting agency.

> Currently, consideration for most university scholarships requires an official test score from ACT or SAT, and we encourage students to provide us their test scores as soon as they are available for maximum scholarship consideration.
