PRIORITY **SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE**


Applications received before this date will be considered for all available scholarship programs.

Test scores and updated transcripts and all information postmarked prior to the Friday before the spring semester begins at OSU.





Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) available

We encourage all students to complete the FAFSA as soon as possible using OSU's school code, 003170. Starting Oct. 1, the 2025-26 FAFSA will open for a limited number of students and will become fully available to all students and families by Dec. 1. Priority for programs with limited funds is given to students who file the FAFSA early and respond promptly to any additional information

Early Opportunity Scholarship Deadline

Students who apply before this date and are admitted will be considered for the highest level of academic scholarships.

Applications received before this date will be considered for all available scholarship programs.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Money from outside the household that helps pay college expenses.

WHAT IS THE FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is an online form that must be completed to apply for federal student aid, such as federal grants, work-study and loans. The FAFSA is also used to determine eligibility for state and school aid. Visit fafsa.gov to complete the form.

SOURCES OF FINANCIAL AID

- The federal government is the largest source of grants, loans and work-study.
- OSU offers many scholarships based on need and/or merit (i.e., test scores and GPA).

ESTIMATED COSTS

Estimated expenses are shown below for on-campus students for the 2025-26 school year. Your actual costs will vary. These estimates are based on block rate tuition, which charges a single rate for students taking 12 to 18 credit hours per semester. The block rate is a great tool for you to make the most of your tuition dollars and finish college on time. For additional information, visit okla.st/tuition-fees.

Getting a part-time job is a great way to build your résumé with work experience while developing time management skills and helping cover costs and personal expenses. There are more than 5,000 on-campus jobs available to OSU students. On-campus jobs usually offer 12 to 20 hours of work per week. Many jobs are available in the Stillwater community, too. Finding a job is as easy as applying online at careerservices.okstate.edu. Jobs will be available for search after enrollment.

FERGUSON SCHOLARSHIPS

The Ferguson College of Agriculture and its departments annually award more than \$1.8 million in scholarships to students enrolled in and entering the college. When awarding scholarships, we look at several areas of your background including (but not limited to) scholastic standing in high school or college, organization and community involvement, financial need and sincere interest in the various college disciplines. Students from all majors are considered for university scholarships, which can be combined with college and departmental scholarship opportunities.

OPPORTUNITIES TO SUCCEED

OSU's Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid can help you navigate the process to take advantage of all your options. OSU awards more than \$320 million in scholarships, grants and financial aid each year, including great scholarships for out-of-state students like you. To maximize your financial aid options, file your FAFSA and submit your complete application as soon as possible. We encourage you to call or visit the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid while on campus so our financial aid counselors can help you find the best solution for your individual situation.

ACCESS AND AFFORDABILITY

Based on our block-rate tuition. Oklahoma's Promise at OSU can provide you with more than \$6,420 per year in assistance toward tuition and other costs, such as books and fees or room and board. This includes an additional \$1,000 award, called Cowboy Covenant, that you'll receive as an admitted Oklahoma's Promise student. Your Oklahoma's Promise award can be combined with other scholarships you may receive.

Consider the BIG PICTURE

TUITION AND FEES

Create a game plan to ensure you graduate college on time. At OSU, the average number of credit hours to complete a degree is 120 credit hours. To graduate in four years, you must complete 30 credit hours per year. Staying on track with your degree plan and graduating on time can save you money and ensure you start your career sooner.



HOUSING AND FOOD

If possible, consider less expensive housing options. This may include selecting a less expensive housing style preference and meal plan, or you may decide to apply for a position as a community mentor to reduce costs after your freshman year.



BOOKS AND SUPPLIES

You can reduce the amount you pay for books and supplies if you rent or buy used books and carefully consider what course materials are necessary. Students who purchase their books from the OSU Student Union Bookstore can use the textbook buyback option each semester, or you may consider using the library's textbook reserve option.



PERSONAL EXPENSES

Watch these expenses closely. Create a budget and set spending limits for yourself. Saving up from a summer job and budgeting for the year ahead are great ways to set yourself up for success.



OSU BURSAR ACCOUNT

Your student bursar account is a record of charges, payments and applied financial assistance. The Office of the Bursar bills and collects all university-related charges for a student. Our payment plan option provides flexibility to pay expenses in regular monthly installments, rather than one lump sum.



TRAVEL EXPENSES

Utilize OSU's bus system on campus and in Stillwater, which is free to students. A shuttle service is also available between OSU campuses in Stillwater and Tulsa. Consider riding a bike when possible, use discount airline fares and other inexpensive travel methods for your trips to and from school.
