Instructions to Determine Who is Considered a Contributor (Parent) for the FAFSA

These instructions are taken directly from the FAFSA as guidance for you to make sure you include information about the correct people on the FAFSA. If, after reviewing the information, you determine that you did not list the correct people, you should revise your FAFSA as quickly as possible.

- If your parent was never married and does not live with your other legal parent, or if your parent is widowed or not remarried, answer parent questions about that parent.
- If your legal parents (biological, adoptive, or as determined by the state [for example, if the parent is listed on the birth certificate]) are not married to each other and **live together**, select “Unmarried and both parents living together” and provide information about both of them regardless of their gender.
- If your legal parents are married, select “Married or “Remarried.”
- If your legal parents are divorced but living together, select “Unmarried and both parents living together.”
- If your legal parents are separated but living together, select “Married or “Remarried,” not “Divorced or “Separated.”
- If the parents are divorced or separated, answer the questions about the parent who provides the greater portion of the student’s financial support, even if the student does not live with them. If both parents provided an exactly equal amount of financial support during the past 12 months, or if they don’t support the student financially, answer the questions about the parent with the greater income and assets. **If this parent is remarried as of the day the FAFSA was signed, answer the questions about that parent and the parent’s spouse.**
- If your widowed parent is remarried as of the date you filed the FAFSA, answer the questions about that parent and your stepparent.
