Note A: Foreign language proficiency may be met through any of the following paths: (a) 9 hours of study of a single, modern foreign language with a minimum grade of "C"; (b) Study in a foreign country approved by the department head and 6 hours of study of a single, modern foreign language; (c) 3 hours of intermediate or advanced modern. To use option (b) – complete 6 hours of foreign language and also complete a study abroad trip that will count towards remaining 3 hours of language and 3 hours of upper division business.
